

A 27-acre wooded island in Frenchman Bay popular for picnicking and camping.




The shore of Bean Island during the Preserve Grand Opening and Frenchman Bay Conservancy Annual Meeting in 2016.

The Chafee family

owned the island for approximately 100 years, grazing sheep on its largely treeless pasture until the 1980s. The island was donated to Frenchman Bay Conservancy in 2016. Acadia National Park holds a conservation easement on Bean Island.
