



This 600-acre preserve protects important habitat for migrating birds and rare plants.



Bog bridging protects sensitive plants and your feet from wet ground!

The wooded trail reaches overlooks of the bog and beaver dams and lodges. Watch for flycatchers, warblers, and woodpeckers, especially in the spring.

Beaver activity has created wet areas that put parts of the trail underwater in spring and summer.

The property conserved valuable wetland next to Maine Coastal Island National Wildlife Refuge and Grand Marsh.

Directions: from Rte 1N/Hancock-Sullivan bridge, drive 9.1 miles and turn right onto Rt 195 S to Prospect Harbor/Corea. Continue for 4.8 miles to the Rte 186 junction and turn left, drive 0.1 mile, and turn right on Rte 195 (Corea Rd). Continue for 2 miles to the preserve parking on the left.
