This beaver pond along the trail supports dragonflies, wildflowers, songbirds, and other wildlife. Bring your binoculars!

Explore a 438-acre preserve home to many natural streams and bogs that support deer, beaver, bobcat, grouse, songbirds, and wildflowers.

The wet upland forest filters and

cleans water that flows into the Maine Coastal Islands National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) and West Bay.

Directions: from Rte 1N/Gouldsboro, turn right onto Chicken Mill Rd. Continue 0.4 mile and turn right onto Fletcher Wood Rd. Drive 0.2 mile and take the first left (follow Maine Coastal Islands National Wildlife Refuge signs for Gouldsboro Bay Trails) onto a gravel road for 0.1 mile to the combined FBC and Wildlife Refuge parking lot.
